

## Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure Report 2016-17

The Pupil Premium Grant provide additional support for looked after children and those from low income families. The extra funding is made available to help them narrow the attainment gap between pupils from disadvantaged and more affluent backgrounds. From April 2012 the Pupil Premium was extended to include children who had been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years (FSM 6).

The introduction of the Pupil Premium was welcome at Trent CE Primary where there has been a long-standing commitment to ensuring disadvantaged pupils can be 'the best they can be!'

Pupil Premium funding does not cover the costs of all of the school's initiatives to support disadvantaged or vulnerable pupils.

The leadership of the school, including the governing body:

• Ensure that all funds delegated to the school are used to provide the best possible outcomes for all children in the school

In respect of Pupil Premium:

- Ensure that Pupil Premium funding is carefully targeted at the designated children
- Identify clearly how the money is being spent.
- Monitor and evaluate Pupil Premium spending and spend it in ways known to be most effective.
- Encourage parents and carers to apply for free school meals by removing barriers to its take-up.

#### At Trent, we also:

- ✓ Enhance mentoring (by our FLO -Family Liaison Officer- Mrs O'Boyle) to support pupils to make better progress in both academic and personal outcomes through well-targeted support to improve attendance, behaviour and links with families where these are barriers to a pupil's learning.
- ✓ Increase subsidies to facilitate equality of access to additional educational activities including trips and residential visits.
- ✓ Fund visiting authors, theatre groups and musicians which benefit all pupils, not simply those linked to Pupil Premium payments
- ✓ Target access to homework support from Reception to Key Stage 2 through Teaching assistants and our FLO
- ✓ Focus on giving pupils clear, useful feedback about their work, and ways that they could improve it, with additional adult volunteers
- ✓ Subsidise attendance at the school's out of hours care provisions: Breakfast Club, after school clubs and Tea-time club. (See website for details)
- ✓ Subsidise 1:1 music lessons in an instrument of choice by the child: drums, violin, piano and voice are current favourites!
